Declaration of interest for items on the agenda and applications for dispensation

Note to Councillors

You have a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest in a matter to be discussed if it relates to something on your Register of Interests form. You must declare the interest and leave the room while the matter is dealt with.

You have a Personal Interest in a matter to be discussed if it affects:

- your well-being or financial position
- your family or close friends
- a club, society or charity in which you have a management role
- another public body of which you are a member to a greater extent than others in your parish
- any body, one of whose principal purposes includes the influence of public opinion or policy (including any political party or trade union), and where you are in a position of general control or management.

You must declare a Personal Interest but can speak and vote on the matter. Whenever you declare an interest you must say why the interest arises, so that it can be included in the minutes.
